St Leonard's Primary School – Sports Premium Funding 2022-2023.

Sport Premium funding runs in financial years and it has not yet been confirmed whether this will continue after April 23. We have therefore planned to use the remaining balance of £7090 for the following projects to:

- Increase staff expertise and grow new PE leaders through coaching and training.
- Development of lunchtime sports activities through implementation of activity zones at lunchtime.
- Continue to encourage active involvement for all children (especially disadvantaged pupils) to engage in after school sports.
- Additional catch up swimming lessons to increase the proportion of pupils who are able to swim 25m.

Impact of Sport Premium funding in 2021-2022

In 2021-2022 we invested quite a significant amount of our sports premium funding into developing more opportunities for outdoor play at break and lunchtimes. The impact was that the majority of our children are not active for at least 30 minutes each day in addition to their 2 hours of PE.

We were able to once again offer swimming lessons. We planned to offer our usual year 3/4 offer but also to run catch up- swimming sessions for those not yet meeting the standard in year 5/6 however unfortunately, this was not possible due to pool time availability and high demand from other schools due to COVID catch-up.
